ARFF HAZMAT Training

ARFF joined by the Syracuse Fire Department's HAZMAT team participated in Cargo Aircraft Familiarization training in August. The training is designed to help the fire department prepare and respond to any type of air cargo emergency. They began the training with a quick power point presentation at the ARFF station conference room that included the different types of emergencies and the various aircraft that carry the cargo. Following the power point presentation they went to the cargo building where they were given a detailed account of both Fed Ex and UPS' procedures that included the different types of tags to identify hazardous materials, a tour of both facilities and a walk-through of the aircraft. All shifts participated in the training.

Construction Corner

This month the long awaited Passenger Terminal Security and Access Improvement Project will begin. This project will feature a 147,000-square-foot addition that will connect the two concourses of the terminal on the second level, both pre-and-post security passenger security screening points. This project will create a single central passenger screening location on a new second level in what is now the center lobby. This security checkpoint will be accessible from either concourse or from the center of the building. Deplaning passengers will be able to exit each concourse directly to the parking garage or the center of the building.

This regionally significant green project enhances the community's airport gateway image and improves security and customer services without burdening local taxpayers or airport tenants with additional capital and operating expenditures.



The changes that will be most visible this month will include the introduction of the contractor, Hueber-Breuer's employees around the airport community, installation of the separation wall which will be located at the main entrance in front of the Discover the Airport! Exhibit, TSA baggage screening machine relocations and some changes to the Military Courtesy Room.

The new concepts complete a \$400,000.00 renovation of the two S'barro restaurants undertaken by Delaware North.
